
MANAGER, TISSUE CALL CENTER

OVERVIEW

The Manager of Tissue Call Center is responsible for day-to-day management of the Tissue Call Center. This role will also assist in directing the recruitment, development, and retention of department staff. The activities also include input into the orientation of new staff, as well as, any special projects which may be assigned.

EDUCATION & WORK EXPERIENCE NEEDED

- Bachelor's degree in a health science related field or equivalent experience required.
- Minimum of three years' experience working in an OPO call center performing referral screening, family approach and Donor Risk Assessment Interview tasks required.
- 3 - 5 years management experience to include recruiting, training and supervising staff preferred.
- Experience working with OPO call center software, to include, recording software, call hierarchy, and metrics driven aspects for performance measurements.
- Experience recruiting, coaching, motivating and retaining staff.
- Experience reviewing the performance of staff, identifying training needs and planning training sessions.
- Excellent communication skills required. Must have the ability to communicate effectively with all levels of personnel and to represent the organization publicly.
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team required.
- Ability to cope with high levels of stress and able to handle a heavy workload.
